

- GEORGIA MILESTONES MEASURES HOW WELL STUDENTS HAVE LEARNED THE KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS OUTLINED IN THE STATE-ADOPTED CONTENT STANDARDS IN ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS, MATHEMATICS, SCIENCE, AND SOCIAL STUDIES.
- STUDENTS IN GRADES 3 THROUGH 8 TAKE AN END-OF-GRADE ASSESSMENT IN ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS AND MATHEMATICS WHILE STUDENTS IN GRADES 5 AND 8 ARE ALSO ASSESSED IN SCIENCE AND SOCIAL STUDIES.



GEORGIA MILESTONES



- The End of Grade (EOG) measures help determine
 promotion/retention status in grade 3 (reading), grade 5 (reading
 and mathematics), and grade 8 (reading and mathematics)
- The End of Course (EOC) measures serve as the final exam and comprise 20% of a student's final course grade
 - 15% for students enrolled in grade nine for the first time prior to July 1, 2011
- Informs Georgia's accountability measures (CCRPI, Growth, Educator Effectiveness)
- Provides a college and career readiness signal
